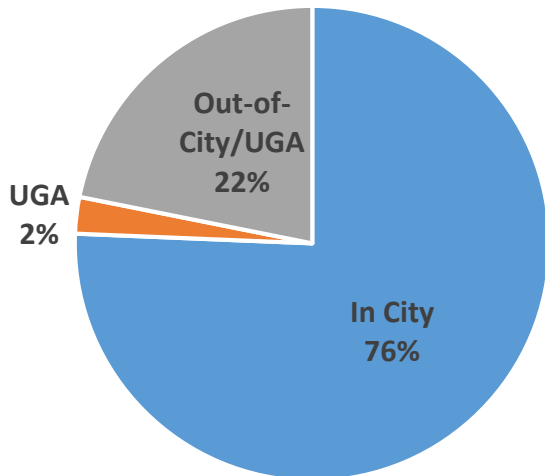

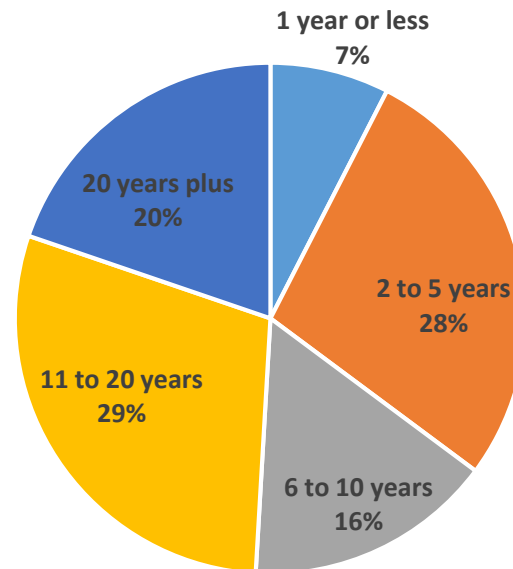

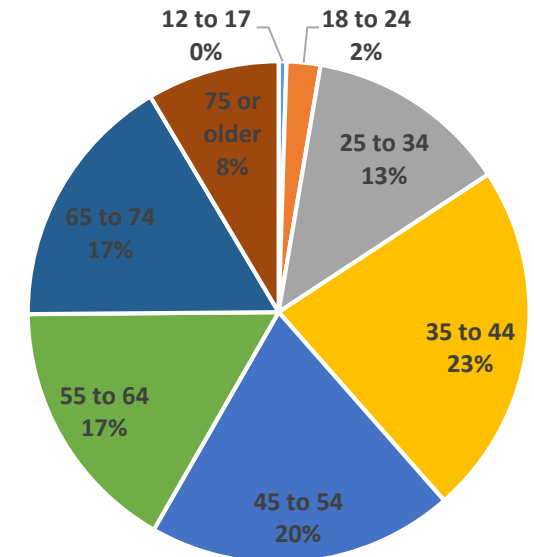
How long have you been a resident of Battle Ground?

What is your age group?

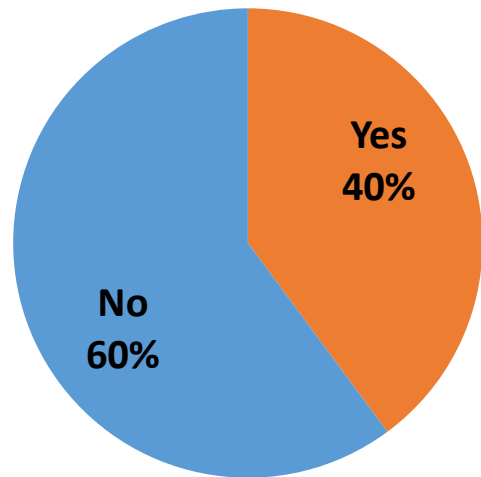

No	359	60%

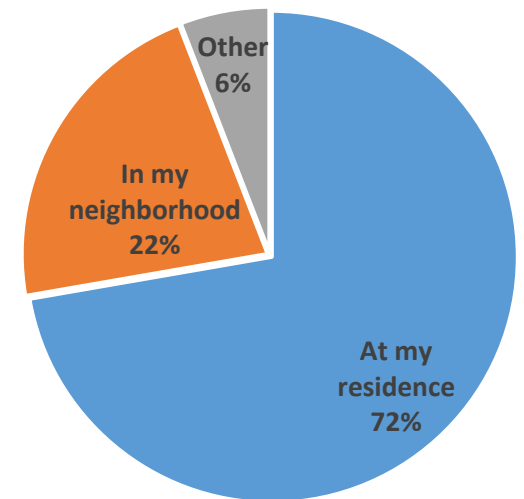


If yes, how many days do you discharge fireworks during the 4th of July holiday season?

If yes, where do you typically discharge fireworks?

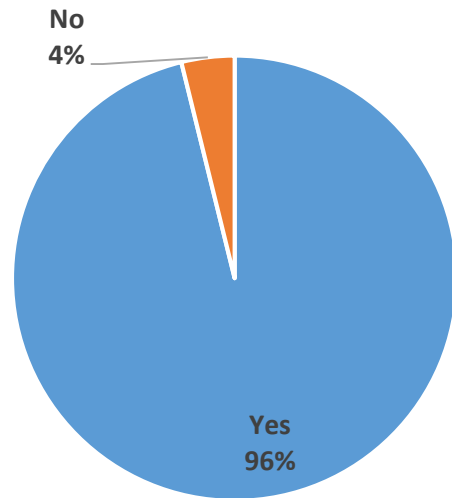

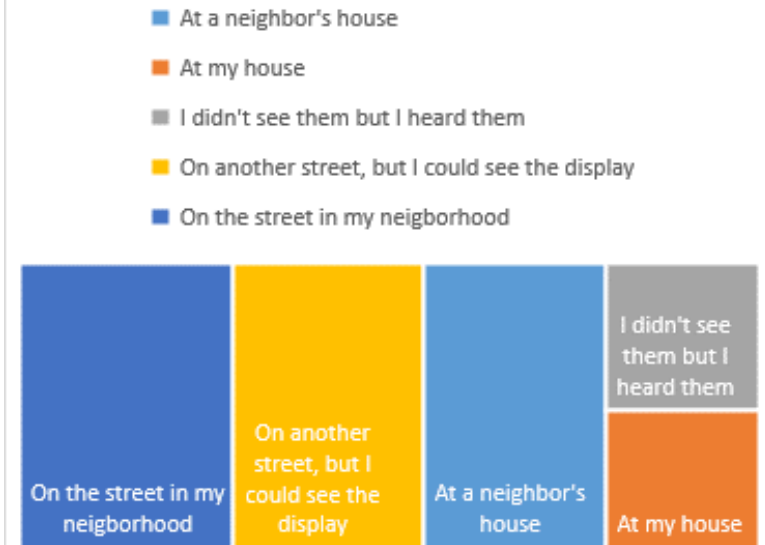
In a typical year during the 4th of July holiday season, how many days do you observe fireworks in your area or neighborhood?

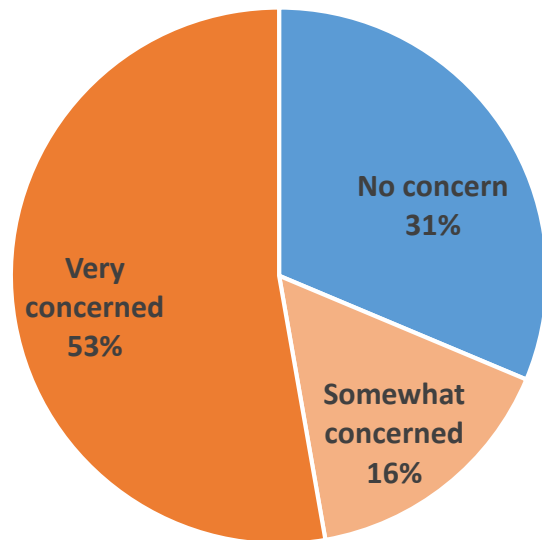
If yes, where were the fireworks discharged in relation to your residence?

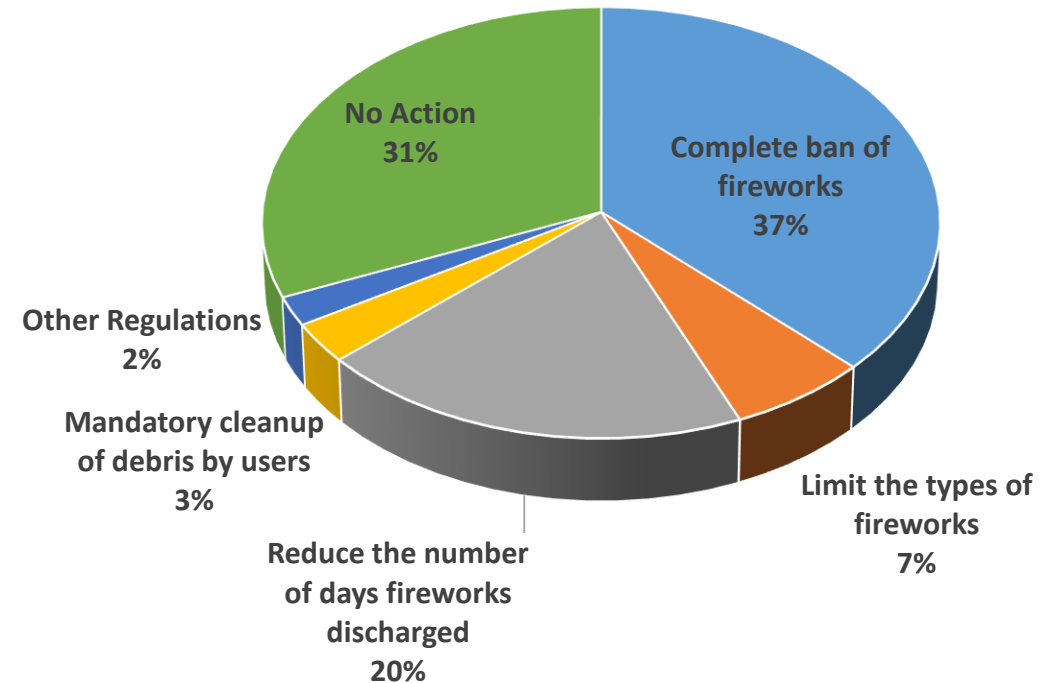


What Action should be Taken?

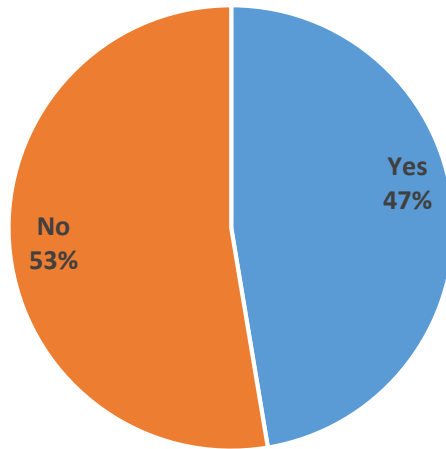
Complete ban of fireworks	222	37%

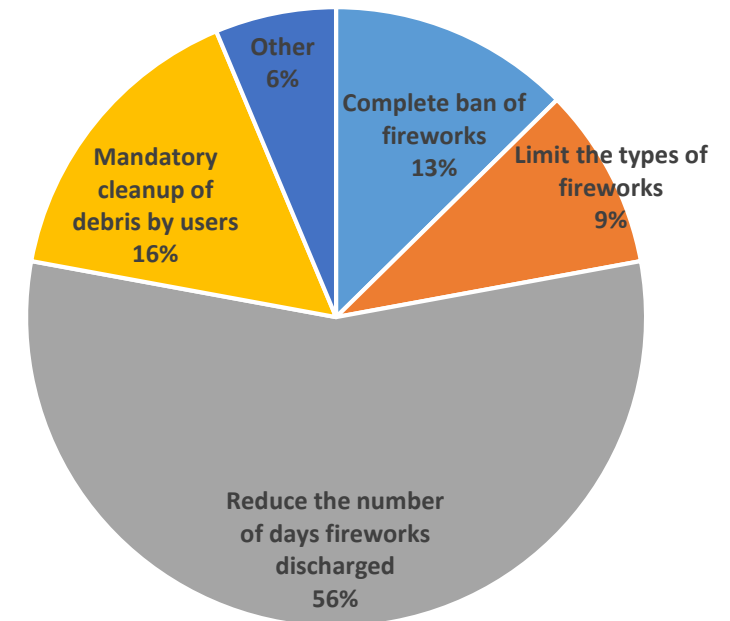


In a typical year during the 4th of July holiday season, how many days do you observe fireworks in your area or neighborhood?

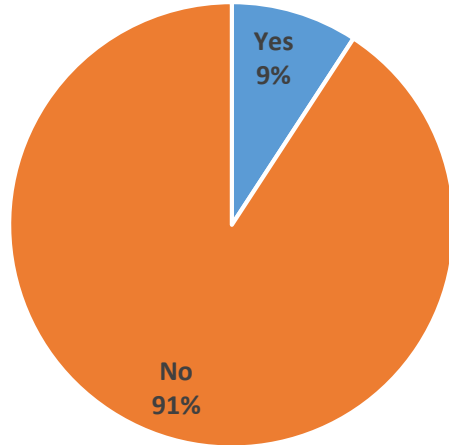

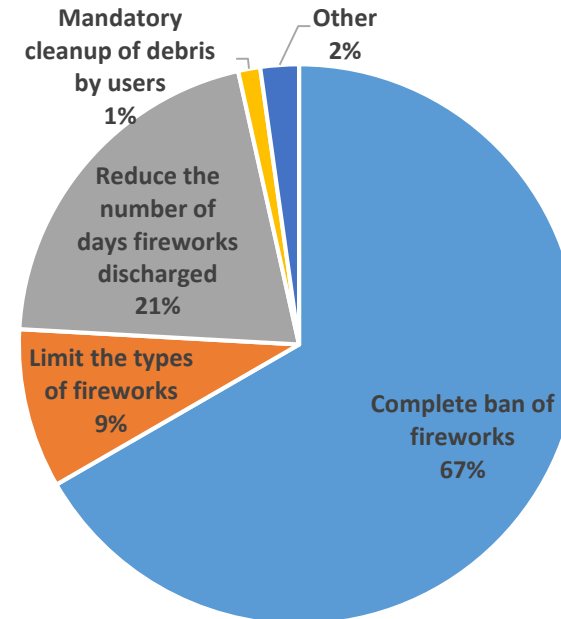


In a typical year during the 4th of July holiday season, how many days do you observe fireworks in your area or neighborhood?

Other/Additional Concerns...

It's a very stressful time for military combat veterans.

Lack of enforcement, supervision and control, lack of respect by others for those who offended

Distress to the elderly, sick and babies. Those who work and are trying to sleep. PTSD to our veterans.

Sleep deprivation

Air and water pollution--harming fish and wildlife

Lack of common sense

Consistent use beyond the days/times allowed. They are set off well past midnight on the days allowed, and into the month of July.

People from cities that have banned fireworks coming into Battle Ground to set off theirs!

I feel that our neighborhoods are turned into war zones and the energy is divisive and aggressive. I also worry about veterans with PTSD, brush fires and house fires. Our streets are left with litter, plastic pellets and explosives powder - which gets washed into the Salmon Creek watershed.

Other/Additional Actions to Mitigate

Stricter enforcement of illegal use outside of designated days.

More patrols during 4th of July. No warning strict enforcement of regulations.

If you do ban fireworks in battle ground, I think it would be fun to have a fireworks display at a local park for people to go to. With professionals setting off the fireworks, to reduce injury and fire risk in the area. Have a small entry fee for each family or group to cover the cost.

Year by year evaluation, wet conditions loosen criteria, hot/dry consider total ban

I think the police need to be out enforcing the time restrictions. I understand that the fireworks are fun but I just wish people would follow the rules.

Only allow the safe and sane type of small fireworks, nothing that can be launched above a roof top level and restrict the decibel level of the fireworks. Reduce the use to only the 4th and only new years night. Folks can still enjoy without the problems fireworks cause. Thanks for asking..!
