RESOLUTION IN THE MATTER OF THE
INCORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF
BATTLE GROUND, WASHINGTON.

WHEREAS, on the 26th day of May, 1951, a special election was held to determine whether or not a corporation to be known as the Town of Battle Ground, Washington, should be established embracing the territory hereinafter described, the holding of said election being evidenced by a Certificate of Election of the Clark County Election Board dated May 28th, 1951: and

WHEREAS, by a canvass of the votes made pursuant to law, it appears that 247 persons voted at said special election, and that the proposition for the establishment of the corporation carried by the vote hereinafter set forth, to-wit:

Proposed Incorporation "Town of Battle Ground"	
For Incorporation.....	137
Against Incorporation.....	108

That the following named persons received the highest number of votes for the several elective municipal offices prescribed by law for cities of the fourth class, to-wit:

Mayor.....	P. I. Rasmussen.....	119 votes
Treasurer.....	H. Alfred Stith.....	128 votes
Councilman.....	E. J. Sullivan.....	95 votes

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Washington, that the territory included within the following described boundaries in Clark County, Washington to-wit:

Beginning at the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between Sections 35, T4N, R2E, W.M., and Section 2, T3N, R2E, W.M.; thence South along the centerline at said Section 2, a distance of 1300 feet, more or less, to the East right-of-way line at the Northern Pacific Railroad; thence Southeasterly along the East right-of-way line at said Northern Pacific Railroad, a distance of 2950 feet, more or less, to a point on the East West centerline of the South $\frac{1}{2}$ of said Section 2; thence West a distance of 1340 feet, more or less, to a point 660 feet West of the North and South centerline of Section 2; thence North, a distance of 2640 feet to the East & West centerline of the North $\frac{1}{2}$ of said Section 2; thence West 1980 feet to the West line of Section 2, T3N, R2E; thence West a distance of 1320 feet, more or less, in Section 3, T3N, R2E, W.M. to a point on the North & South centerline of the East $\frac{1}{2}$ of said Section 3; thence North 1320 feet, more or less, to the center of a right-of-way of Secondary State Highway 1-S; thence West along the center right-of-way of said Secondary State Highway 1-S a distance of 1980 feet, more or less, to a point South of the Southwest corner of School District No. 115 property; thence North in Section 34, T4N, R2E, W.M. on the West Boundary line of said School District No. 115 property, a distance of 1320 feet, more or less to

the East and West centerline of the South $\frac{1}{2}$ of said Section 34; thence East in said Section 34 on the North line of said School District No. 115 property, a distance of 1980 feet, more or less to the North and South centerline of the East $\frac{1}{2}$ of said Section 34; thence North on the North and South centerline of the East $\frac{1}{2}$ of said Section 34, a distance of 1320 feet, more or less, to the East and West centerline of said Section 34; thence East on the East and West centerline of Sections 34 and 35, T4N, R2E, W.M., a distance of 4190 feet, more or less to a point 230 feet East of the center of said Section 35; thence South parallel with the North and South centerline of said Section 35, a distance of 2640 feet more or less, to the South line of said Section 35; thence West along the South line of said Section 35, a distance of 230 feet to the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between said Sections 35 and 2 and point of beginning.

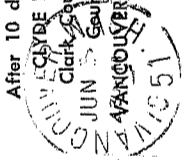
